
### **Diagnoses by Race/Ethnicity**

In 2018, Blacks/African Americans **and** Hispanics/Latinos accounted for **69% of HIV diagnoses** but comprised only 31% of the U.S.\*\* population.




### Diagnoses Among MSM by Race/Ethnicity in 2018\*
